


One factor that has made this more difficult is the development of Christian religious division.

- How do we successfully fulfill our duty to teach them with all the confusion caused by division?

Do Not Despair

- It can be difficult to convince someone there are problems with their religious practices.
- But the churched can be reached by the same Gospel that saves those that do not know Jesus.

Meet People Where They Are

- Acts 2 They believed the Law and the Prophets – they needed Jesus.
- Acts 17 Athenian philosophers did not know God – they needed God.
- Get to know where churched people are in their faith – don't assume you already know.
- Avoid addressing the differences to be between church and Bible teaching first. They may need something else.



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
Approach an Individual from a Place of Respect

Apollos Speaks Boldly in Ephesus Acts 18:24-28

Now a Jew named Apollos, a native of Alexandria, came to Ephesus. He was an eloquent man, competent in the Scriptures. He had been instructed in the way of the Lord. And being fervent in spirit, he spoke and taught accurately the things concerning Jesus, though he knew only the baptism of John. He began to speak boldly in the synagogue, but when Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him aside and explained to him the way of God more accurately. And when he wished to cross to Achaia, the brothers encouraged him and wrote to the disciples to welcome him. When he arrived, he greatly helped those who through grace had believed, for he powerfully refuted the Jews in public, showing by the Scriptures that the Christ was Jesus.

Stick to What Needs to Be Taught

- The churched need the saving message of Jesus Christ.
 - Jesus came to earth
 - Lived as a servant
 - Was crucified by his own people
 - Was raised on the 3rd day
 - Returned to Heaven
 - Left us with the Gospel to guide our lives
- Let's not squander the opportunity to teach them by focusing too soon on doctrinal differences – There will be time for that!
- Consider how Jesus and the Apostles started with these foundational truths and built from there.



Conclusion

- There is reason for hope that we can teach the churched – if we trust in the power of the Gospel!
- Be careful to assess where they are in their spiritual walk and begin teaching from there.
- Stick to what needs to be taught in the moment – there will be time for maturity.
