










- For the lame man, as well as for Peter and John, it was a normal day.
  - The lame man was begging.
  - Peter and John were preaching the Gospel.
- Their encounter was by chance.
  - They simply crossed each others path that morning.
- When the lame man asked for their help, he never imagined the help he would receive.
- The miracle performed served to convince many to obey Jesus but the event was prompted by taking the Gospel to those who suffer!



- The answer the lame man received from Peter and John was unexpected:
  - 3:6a But Peter said, "I have no silver and gold,"
- The lame man must have thought,
   "Well I look for someone else to help me."




- But Peter quickly continued:
  - 3:6b "but what I do have I give to you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk!"
- That was certainly more than he expected!
  - He stood, walked and leaped.
- It was not a normal day, the Gospel touched a lost and suffering soul!
- The story doesn't end here.




- The lame man went about praising God.
- Peter addressed the assembling crowd.
  - 3:12 And when Peter saw it he addressed the people: "Men of Israel, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we have made him walk?
- Why do you wonder? Why do you stare at us?
  - They took no credit for the events that day.




- Peter continued:
  - 3:13 The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, glorified his servant Jesus, whom you delivered over and denied in the presence of Pilate, when he had decided to release him.
- He preached Jesus to them, and many responded in obedience.



 Peter and John were arrested and taken before the Sanhedrin where they were told to stop speaking about Jesus.




- Peter and John responded to their demands by saying:
  - 4:19-20 But Peter and John answered them, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God, you must judge, for we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard."





No matter the physical condition, one's spiritual conditions must be addressed.

Peter and John were concerned for the lost and recognized the opportunity to help the suffering.





- The correct spiritual condition will help one endure any physical condition they encounter.
- They may continue to suffer physically but they will be equipped with the power of prayer to help.

- We may react to someone suffering by offering money and miss the opportunity to give them something of much more value.
- They need the Gospel more than anything else.
- Fear of rejection may cause us to hesitate in sharing the Gospel.
